Thank you so much for volunteering as a worship assistant. If you are not able to serve on your scheduled Sunday, **please make your own arrangements** with someone from the schedule. Please let the office know if you need help or make any changes. Your dedication to the ministries of Pella Lutheran Church is very much appreciated!

For the time being, Usher duties have been modified:  
We do *not* pass offering plates.

First, please raise the flags! Greet people as they enter and offer them a Sunday bulletin. You should also be able to direct people to the restrooms, coat rack, elevator, etc. Also acquaint yourself with the location of the nearest fire extinguisher & Emergency Defibrillator (near elevator/south door).

We ask that you count & record the number of people in attendance. Assist Pastor by removing the lids on the Communion trays & directing members of the congregation forward to receive Communion, collecting their white Communion cards as they exit their pews.

At the close of worship, Ushers gather donations from the offering plates in the Narthex and the front entrance (near the organ), put in a bank bag, secure it in the lock box under the Altar, tidy the Sanctuary (collect bulletins, note papers, etc left in pews or on floor and dispose of) and return the flags to the Information Desk.

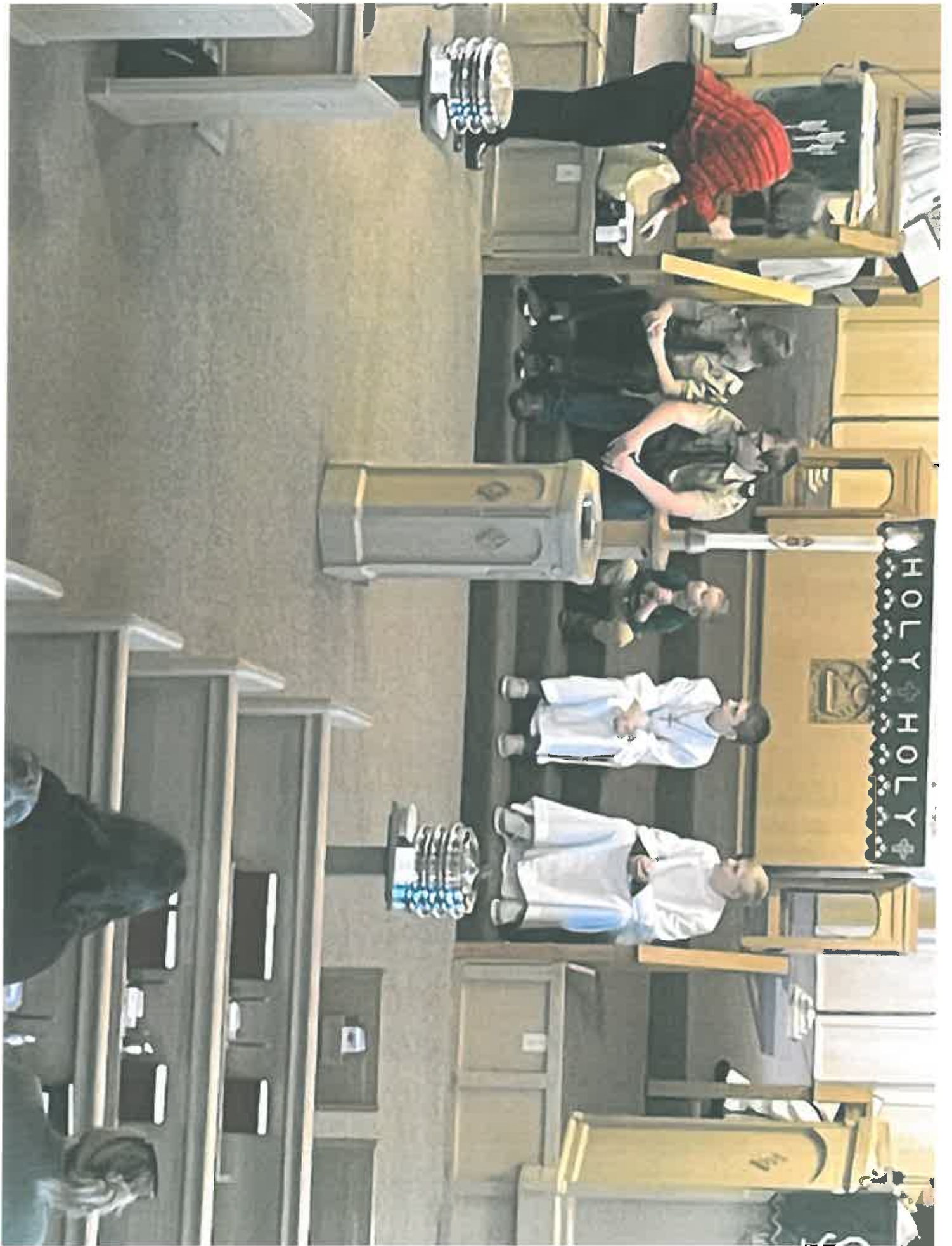



Dr. Joseph Golden McKinley, Jr., died on Tuesday, Jan. 31, 2023, at Kempton Heritage Elder Care, Hermitage, TN. Joseph was born Aug. 15, 1933, in Kansas City, MO, the first child of Dr. Joseph G. McKinley, Sr., and Emma Jean (Jeffrey) McKinley. His two younger sisters, Carmen Colean, and Janette followed later.

The family was apart for a while due to illness. Emma and baby Joe went to her parents in Arkansas while his father moved to Santa Fe where he worked in a sanatorium. After the family joined him there, they moved to Farmington, NM. Emma and baby Joe joined his father in Farmington and then moved to a brief time in his hometown of Durango, CO where Joe was three. Joe spent his first school years in Pagosa Springs. The family moved to Durango, CO, when Joe was 12. Joe graduated from Durango High School in 1950 at age 18. He then attended the University of Colorado in Boulder and was accepted into the University of Colorado School of Medicine in 1954. He received his M.D. degree in June 1958, and went on to do an internship at San Diego County Hospital, San Diego, CA. Following his internship, he returned to the University of Colorado School of Medicine in Denver to start his residency in pathology.

Joe met his future wife, Dr. Sarah Ann (Selbe) McKinley, in San Diego, where they both interned. Joe and Sarah were blessed with three children: Joseph Douglas, James Thomas, and John Jeffrey.

Joe enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1961, and was stationed at San Antonio, TX, but the research station where he worked was in Austin, TX. Following Joe's discharge from the Air Force, the family returned to Denver, where Joe finished his residency in pathology.

Joe's first pathology practice was at Rikerout Hospital, Marysville, CA, followed by a brief time in his hometown of Durango, CO, before he moved to Sidney, MT where he practiced pathology at Sidney Community Hospital for 30 years, retiring in 1993.

During his retirement years Joe spent his time reading, enjoying his long-time collection of old cars, studying languages, and enjoying a few family vacations. Joe's health started deteriorating and his sons took him to Nashville, TN as he could be treated at Vanderbilt University. He spent the last three and a half years in Hermitage, TN, a suburb of Nashville.

Joe is survived by his wife, Sarah, and his three sons: Joseph Douglas, Sidney, MT; James (Judy), Old Hickory, TN; and John Jeffrey, Billings, MT; youngest sister, Janette; two nephews Jonathan and Gabriel Cole, 4 grandsons, and numerous other family members.

Joe was preceded in death by his parents, and his sister, Carmen, and a niece, Rachel Timie (Cole) Matthews.
