- If you have a large group, are you willing to split up to do separate projects, or limit your numbers to have more options for project work if we have staff and project work to make this happen?

When bringing your group to Glacier to volunteer, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- All groups members will be required to participate in the work project.
- Work will be outdoors which could include hot sun, pouring rain, and windy conditions. Volunteers should take all necessary safety precautions and prepare for the weather, including staying well-hydrated, wearing sun protection (SPF lotion, hat), packing rain gear and wearing multiple layers of clothing.
- Fieldwork includes potential exposure to unstable terrain, biting insects, wild animals, thorny plants and other environmental hazards.
- It is strongly recommended that all group members wear long pants and closed-toed shoes.
- Be aware that arrangements will have to be made for weekend projects, as our staff does not usually work on weekends.

As applications are received, group leaders will be contacted to begin processing the request and discuss possible projects. A confirmation email will be sent to the group leader with all the necessary information for the group. This process will begin in February, when the Volunteer Program Manager returns from furlough.
